

## **BOSTON MODERN ORCHESTRA PROJECT**GIL ROSE, CONDUCTOR

The Boston Modern Orchestra Project pays homage to its geographical roots with the thoroughly New England composer Walter Piston. Full of mid-twentieth century neoclassicism, this disc contains not one but two world premiere recordings from the "ultimate musical craftsman." Variations on a Theme by Edward Burlingame Hill remembers Piston's former teacher; Divertimento is a spry chamber piece from some of his earlier compositions; and frequent BMOP orchestra member Michael Norsworthy tackles Piston's Concerto for Clarinet and Orchestra. The earliest work on this disc, Concerto for Orchestra, earned Piston critical praise after its premiere but has been largely neglected since. This world premiere recording brings it back to the public eye.
